

Entry 191: Collecting Poems—Part 1

Two Poems	Browse through several of the poetry books and find two different poems that you like. Copy them neatly in your journal.
Close Reading	<p>Read one of the poems at least five separate times, following the instructions for each "reading" carefully:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The first time, underline strong or descriptive words that stand out to you. 2. The second time, circle strong or descriptive words (some may be the same as last time, others will be new). 3. The third time, find and label examples of personification, metaphor, and or simile in the poem. 4. The fourth time, identify and label different types of rhyme (if present), and label the rhyme scheme. 5. Finally, read the poem one more time very slowly, considering the following: a) what seems to be happening? b) who is speaking? c) what is the mood (feeling) of the poem?
Paraphrase	Rewrite the poem in your own words.
Response ½ page	<p>Respond to the poem. Use the following prompts to help you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What do you like or dislike about it what it says? Why? • What do you like or dislike about the way it is written? Why? • What is your favorite line? Why? • What seems confusing or unclear to you about the poem?
Repeat	Complete this activity thoughtfully for the second poem.

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
