**Overview** To demonstrate your understanding of poetry and its elements, compile a poetry booklet of your own. Include all of the components described.

**Components**

**Original Poems** Include the poems you have written (or will write) this term, as well as any others you've written that you wish to include. Give each poem an appropriate title.

- bio-poems (2 – from *Night* unit)
- extended metaphor/simile poem
- limericks (2)
- personification poem
- sonnet
- sound devices poem
- comparison poem
- sensory details poem

**Published Poems** Include at least eight poems written by others that provide good examples of the poetry terms we have discussed (or will discuss) in class:

- alliteration
- approximate rhyme
- assonance
- consonance
- couplet
- end rhyme
- free verse poetry
- imagery
- internal rhyme
- lyric poetry
- metaphor
- metrical poetry
- narrative poetry
- onomatopoeia
- personification
- quatrain
- repetition
- rhyme scheme
- simile
- speaker
- stanza
- tone

These poems **may not** be poems we read together as a class. You may use one poem to highlight more than one of the terms listed, but you must have at least eight poems in this section. Be sure to include poets' names and poem titles.

**Glossary of Terms** Include a section to clarify the terminology of poetry. For each term listed in the section above, provide the following:

1. A clear definition
2. An example from one (or more) of the published poems in your book
3. Explanation to clarify your example(s) for readers
4. Page numbers that show where examples can be found in your booklet

**Format** Compile and arrange your work in a polished and professional booklet:

1. Give your collection an original and appropriate title
2. Create an attractive cover that includes color and graphics
3. Include a title page
4. Organize your booklet with an accurate table of contents
5. Illustrate your pages with drawings and graphics that enhance your presentation of poems and terms
